# Kinsman Township Trumbull County Records of Proceedings

### Regular Trustees Meeting Held on February 12, 2024, at 6:00 P.M.

Chairman Jamin Banning called the regular trustees' meeting to order and asked all present to stand for the Pledge of Allegiance.

Bruce Bancroft made a motion, seconded by Greg Leonhard, to waive the reading of the minutes of the January 8, 2023, regular trustees meeting, and to accept them as read by the trustees. The vote was unanimously approved.

#### **Old Business:**

- Trumbull County Probate Court, along with the Trumbull County Recorder, and Clerk of Courts, will be hosting an informational meeting titled "Good Deeds" to help citizens create an estate plan at the American Legion on Thursday, February 29<sup>th</sup> at 6:30 p.m.
- 2. Greg still has 37 house numbers to be picked up.
- 3. The Pymatuning Creek Scenic River Advisory Committee was held last month. ODNR and the Army Corps of Engineers is working on funding to aid with cleanup of the dump site on State Route 87.
- 4. Trumbull County Engineers, road department and trustees met at the GreenSpace to discuss the layout plan for sidewalks at the location. These sidewalks will be paid for through grants from the Trumbull County Commissioners. No township tax dollars will be used for this sidewalk project.

Greg has applied for the GoGreen Grant for Kinsman Cleanup Day and Scrap Tire Collection Day to be held May 18<sup>th</sup> from 9 a.m. to 1 p.m. The grant will include a U-Haul truck for collection of electronics. Regarding the Scrap Tire Grant, Greg asked for a motion to use Horodyski's this year to keep our business local.

- 3. Road- Another ton of cold patch was laid down on Turner Mullen. Ward Christy and Ray State Line need work. They are caught up with weight limit signs. Greg asked if road work can be put out to bid sooner this year. Ray State Line Road is a priority this year. Cold Patch was \$125,000 per mile the last time it was quoted. The Road Department now has their zero-turn mower and it is good to go.
- 4. Zoning- Mark gave the trustees his monthly report. The old brass works building is having its façade changed but its footprint has not changed. Mark gave the trustees his information on zoning language for cannabis.
- 5. Fire- Tyler told the trustee there were 23 calls and they are voting on one new member. This person is going to school but will run EMS calls. Grants available can cover most of training. For fire extinguisher inspection they are switching from MES to Cadman's in Jamestown to save money. The engine tanker and rescue have been done this week. The helmets need helmet fronts.

He said \$500 should be the top cost. They are currently using 2015 air-pack bottles purchased through a 2015 grant. They have a 15-year life span. Transfer, PA is selling their 2018 bottles for \$1500 for six of them. That is a good deal.

The trustees encouraged everyone to call and email them to discuss why our Local Government Fund distribution is not returned to its original amount, and to not spend the surplus funds on projects for certain townships when smaller townships cannot afford to pay their bills. Monies should be given back to the taxpayers. We need to encourage state legislators to vote no on proposed projects to spend state surplus monies of \$700 million in their General Fund.
